



Clinical Research Information System (CRIS) In-Class Training for Prescribers

The National Institutes of Health and The Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine jointly-present *CRIS Training for Prescribers*.

Description:

CRIS is the Clinical Research Information System used by the NIH Clinical Center and Institute staff for entering orders, viewing results, and documenting patient care.

This course is specifically designed for credentialed NIH Physicians and other Prescribers to offer classroom instruction in how to use the CRIS for viewing patient information, as well as entering and viewing orders and clinical documentation (eg. Progress Notes). Hands on practice in the training system is provided.

Who Should attend:

Practicing Physicians, Physician Assistants, Nurse Practitioners, Nurse Anesthetists and Dentists at NIH, who require access to CRIS to conduct clinical research and provide patient care.

Objectives:

Upon completion of this course, the user will be able to:

- Explain the role of CRIS in supporting clinical research and patient care.
- Demonstrate how to navigate various CRIS features and functionalities.
- Identify how CRIS will improve clinical workflow and management of patient care.
- Successfully utilize CRIS according to their role description and security access.
- In a given clinical scenario, compose medical orders and clinical documentation in CRIS that comply with the standards outlined in Clinical Center's Medical Executive Committee's policies.
